MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORT



The Issaquah Police Department (IPD) has fully transitioned to the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) to collect and report standardized crime data to the FBI. NIBRS categorizes 53 different offenses as crimes against persons, crimes against property and crimes against society. This data, reported as incidents here, is submitted electronically monthly directly to the WASPC repository.

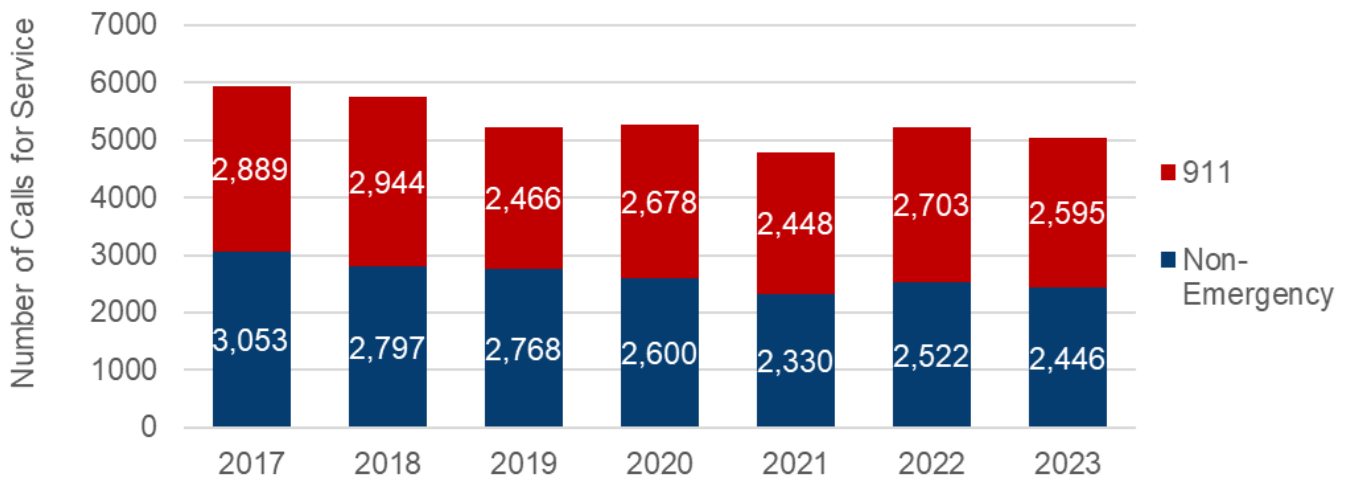

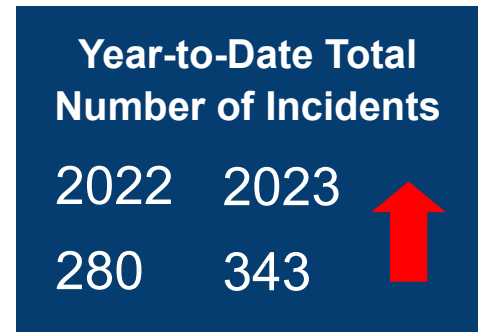

OVERALL CRIME - AUGUST 2023

Of the 53 categories of offenses, each offense collected belongs to one of three categories: Crimes Against Persons, Crimes Against Property, or Crimes Against Society. Crimes Against Persons, e.g., murder, rape, and assault, are those in which the victims are always individuals. The object of Crimes Against Property, e.g., robbery, bribery, and burglary, is to obtain money, property, or some other benefit. Crimes Against Society, e.g., gambling, prostitution, and drug violations, represent society's prohibition against engaging in certain types of activity and are typically victimless crimes.

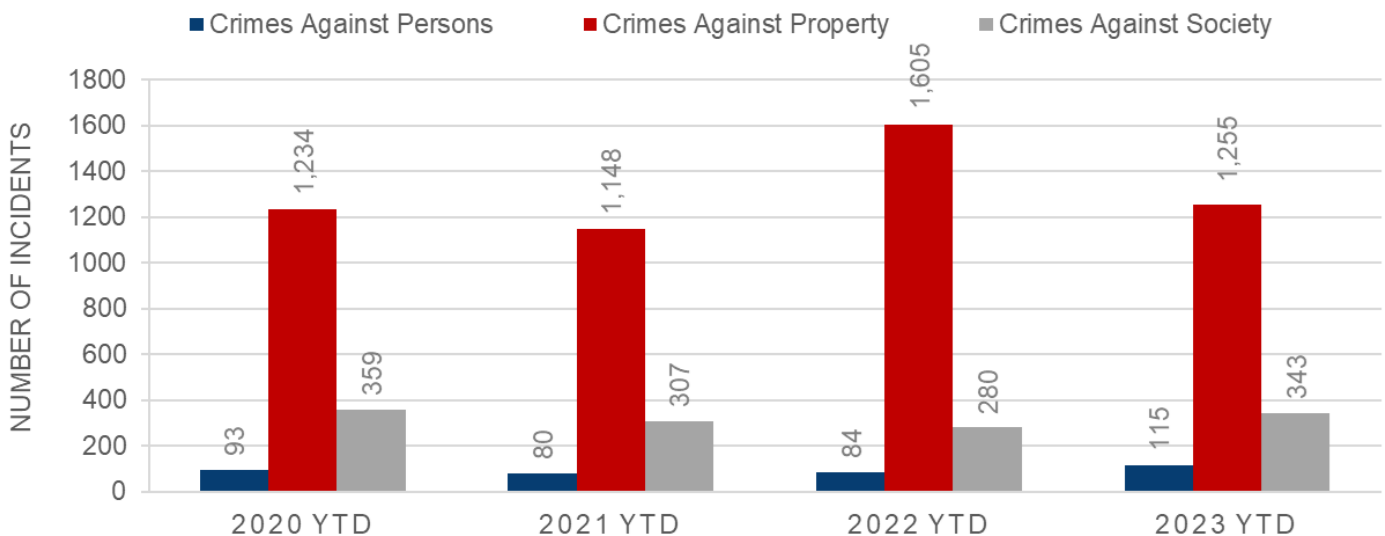
Crimes Against Persons Crimes Against Property Crimes Against Society

Thus far this year, the number of incidents year-to-date has been higher in all categories except for Crimes Against Property when compared to the same time last year. This is due to a decrease in larceny theft cases compared to the previous year. While higher than last year, Crimes Against Society are overall lower than in 2020 when comparing the same time periods. When we compare these crime categories for the same time period over the last few years, Crimes Against Property had the highest proportional share of cases, followed by Crimes Against Society and Crimes Against Persons.

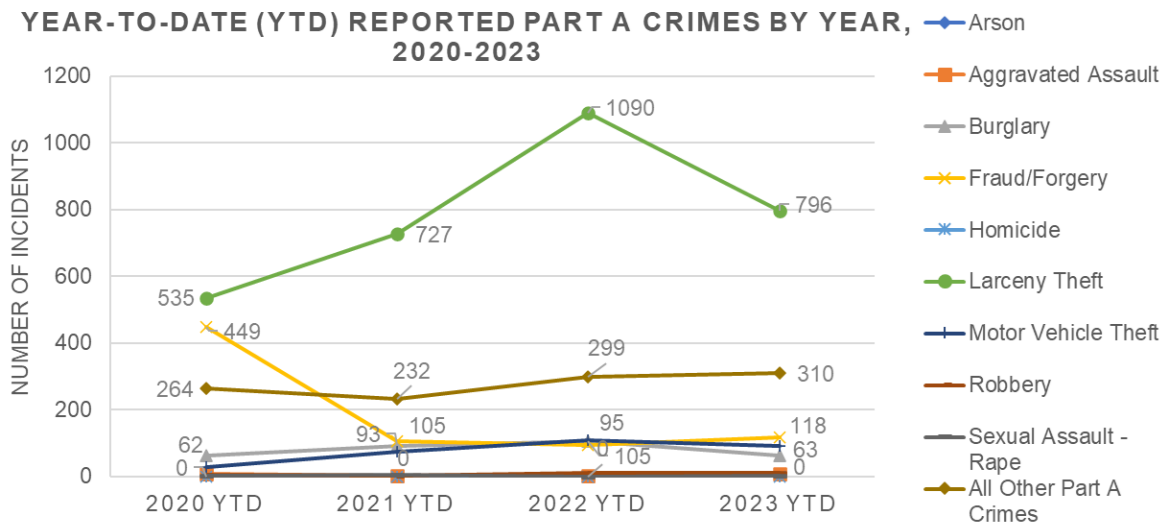

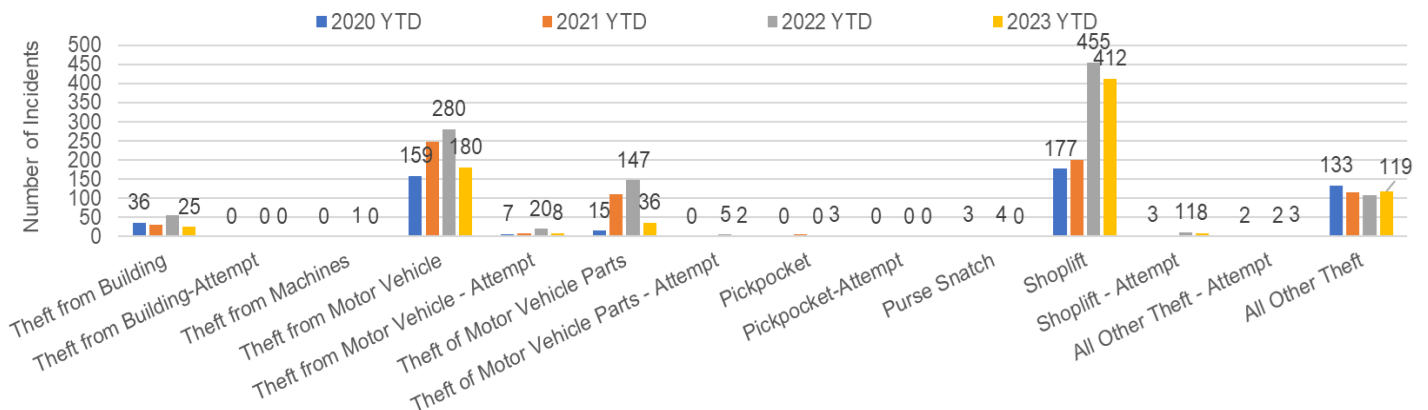

USE OF FORCE (UOF) - AUGUST 2023

This use of force information reflects the Issaquah Police Department's (IPD) commitment to being transparent and collaborative with those served to improve trust and satisfaction with the service provided to the community. This is additionally in alignment with the 2020 Issaquah Police Accountability, Equity, and Human Services Action Plan which pursues the highest quality public safety for residents and visitors to our city. The use of physical force is legally permitted under certain circumstances. Force may be warranted as the nature of an individual's actions becomes more threatening to others or the officer. The IPD Use of Force Policy dictates each incident of reportable force must go through a multi-step internal review process to determine policy compliance.
